An Area of Reasoning may be satisfied by cognate courses in majors (i.e. courses that have a different prefix/discipline than major courses) in the general education program if they are listed below. Major courses cannot apply to both an area of reasoning and a major curriculum. This includes double majors. An additional reasoning course must be taken if a major course is also a reasoning course. This does not apply to minors. Students will take at least 1.5 credits in each area of reasoning; *Creative, Humanistic, Scientific, Social Scientific, and Theological* for a total of 18 credits.
