ADMISSION TO DEGREE CANDIDACY AND FIELD INTERNSHIP

After completion of social work foundation courses at the 300 level, the student submits a formal application for admission to degree candidacy. Applications and candidacy requirements are contained in the Student Handbook. Determination of field internship is made by the program advisors based upon a progress review and determination of academic status, and readiness to enter into an applied practice setting. Students must allow 250 clock hours per semester for the field internship.
